PRESIDENT'S REPORT



I wish to acknowledge the fact that many of our members and friends are no longer with us, whether Covid took them from us or other causes. Lest We Forget.

Nobody could say that these are good times BUT ... Bentleigh RSL has survived and this is because we have good management which results in financial stability. Now it's easy for me to say that our employees and management are all great people and all work hard, put up with ongoing Covid "situations" etc etc but what really stands out is the support from our customers attending the venues. Without the customer base there would be no Bentleigh or Cheltenham RSL's, there wouldn't be the ongoing support to veterans and the community that we provide. The schools, sports clubs and others perhaps didn't receive 100% of their usual donation or scholarship but we still provided at least 80% of it. You don't have to be a rocket scientist to realise that if the Clubs are closed that means the donations have to come from savings. We have a responsibility to our veterans, members, and the community this is why most of us belong to the RSL, it's the "giving" not the "taking" that keeps us so strong. Bentleigh and Cheltenham RSL's can be proud of their achievement in these tough times. Smiling when our carpark area at Cheltenham is full of Covid testing seekers lined up to get to the marque for a jab or test just reminds me to think of the "big picture". We are still here, still providing a safe and friendly environment although we now stand alone in the area, as two large clubs have or are about to close. I like to think we are doing it right, but we make mistakes we could do better so we don't rest on our laurels we keep up staff training, we change we adapt it's a sign of the times.

Although we were forced to close (Covid restrictions on trading) we used this time to

build our new offices for Pensions. Welfare. Presidents/Committee, Veterans lounge and make the staff room larger. Our aim is to service our veterans and their families, we feel this can't be achieved by sending them to the City or elsewhere so we have provided better facilities so our staff can work in a proper environment to help the very people the RSL was established to help. The resulting changes allowed new storage areas to be built and one of them now houses our memorabilia, which previously was spread all over the building. The offshoot of this was a new photographic and logged record of all our memorabilia so we can keep track of it. Changing the upstairs areas (Pension, Welfare and Veterans Lounge) resulted in a new layout in the Ron Smith Room. We now have the ability to divide the room into two areas each with their own entrance. New 80" screens (3) dominate the walls and they can show individual or group presentations. The old Presidents Office and Pensions office have now become a plating room, to keep food warm and to serve it and a new bar that opens into the Ron Smith room. New equipment and a redesign has resulted in a very professional service area for members and quests. If you haven't been in for awhile you will notice that the gaming machines at Bentleigh have been spaced apart to suit Covid spacing restrictions. We have received many positive comments about this move, all stating how they like the privacy the distance between machines gives each player.

The solar panels that were installed at the Bentleigh campus have saved us a lot of money so we now have a similar system at Cheltenham. Although these systems will never cover all of our electricity costs they will pay for themselves in about 5 years, therefore saving us future costs. Cheltenham has not missed out on upgrades, the bar are has been

nearly doubled in size and the gaming area moved around making more room.

Changes to floorplans sound easier than what actually happens, one thing seems to affect another and the next thing you know there's a problem. After our changes upstairs at Bentleigh it was only correct that we made sure the club met its safety requirements, so a fire audit was carried out. Oops, it seems our fire escape was no longer up to standard. I could waffle on about the 'what ifs and maybes" but the fact is we need a new upstairs fire escape and that should be completed by March, until then our numbers upstairs have been reduced. The new fire escape will exit the Ron Smith room and open into the side street through new doors, new stairs etc. We could have done without the extra cost this resulted in. but we have to put the safety of our staff and patrons first.

Bentleigh and Cheltenham RSL's became what they are today because of volunteers, people who gave their time and often money to help others, to build a future to build the foundations of what we have today. Although we employ people to do many of the jobs done by volunteers in the past that does not mean we don't need you. Tammy and Sylvia are always looking for volunteers and although we don't need you all the time, there are plenty of things to do. If you are not in the position yourself, imagine what it's like for many of our veterans and widows/widowers. Alone, nobody to talk to and as they age, the garden still grows, although they are slowing down nothing else does. Medical visits, shopping, cleaning, bill paying all of this becomes very difficult, so a call a visit, can mean so much.

A shortage of staff (healthy or otherwise) is a constant call these days and recently we have been forced to close our bistros and limit our hours of trading, in fact we had to close Cheltenham down completely, so we had enough staff to operate at least one campus and to allow for the carpark problem at Cheltenham re the testing centre. Raffles are back on Friday nights at Bentleigh and are run by the Sporting Bodies. Did you know that we have Swimming, Golf, Darts and Angling clubs operating through the RSL? The clubs are always looking for members so why not come along on a Friday, early evening and say hello.

There are many "behind the scenes" matters taking place in the RSL, some to do with the day to day running of each campus and the never ending political machinations that spring up. Currently there are moves to change the voting procedures that take place at and before the State Conference and another to do with the election of the Executive at State Branch. What appears to be a simple democratic process can have many hidden traps, so the committee discusses and puts forward its opinion on these matters. Should a vote be required then a mailout or email will be sent to advise members of the matter. Rest assured we are working for you, the veteran community and Bentleigh & Cheltenham RSL's.

Looking forward to a fantastic year, may 2022 allow us all to get on with our lives, be healthy and safe.







How quickly can things change living throughout a pandemic!

Providing Welfare support has been challenging with the constantly changing COVID19 restrictions, but despite the ongoing challenges, Tammy, Sophie, and myself have continued to provide services to the veteran community, their families, and our members in need.

The Welfare team has continued to adapt with each lockdown, to working from home, taking on different work roles and constantly stopping and starting programs each time. Our members and veterans have adapted to cancellations, setbacks, and disappointments, taking it in their stride. I hear so many stories from people unable to see family members living interstate, missing birthdays, weddings and other special events, holidays cancelled and nothing to look forward to, but I reassure them, that we are doing our best to stay safe and hope there is light at the end of the tunnel.

The long-awaited renovations are finally completed at Bentleigh, with the new Welfare Veterans Centre now in operation. We have a new Welfare office, Pension Advocate office, meeting room and a safe lounge area for veterans and members to sit in a comfortable

environment. Feel free to visit me on the first floor at Bentleigh anytime.

In between stopping and starting, we did manage to Commemorate Remembrance Day with a service at Bentleigh and Cheltenham. Many of our volunteers did not feel comfortable selling badges in the community which resulted in Rosemary Papalitsas and Wayne Holmes being the only two volunteers who put in many hours and long days. The schools were given the option to sell badges which saw a decline on the total amount we would normally raise. Thank you to the members who continue to support our Remembrance Day Appeal.

The Vietnam Veterans lunch was unfortunately cancelled in August. The men enjoy this biannual event, and many have developed friendships, sharing the experiences they all endured serving our country. We aim to hold the next Vietnam Veterans lunch on Thursday 17th February at Cheltenham and Thursday 18th August at Bentleigh.

Ian Campbell and Ray Fryer, both Vietnam Veterans themselves, have been appointed a new volunteer's role as Veterans Liaison. Ian and Ray will contact new veterans who become members and inform them of the services offered at the RSL and welcome them to our club.

A new service has been introduced to assist members to medical appointments if they fit the criteria. Andrew Coffey, whose late parents were an integral part of the Bentleigh RSL history, has signed up as a volunteer and is more than happy to help out where needed.



The combined bus trips with Bentleigh and Cheltenham have been a huge success. In 2022, we have planned 8 bus trips open to all members from both campuses. The bus alternates departures from Bentleigh and Cheltenham and payment for each event will be open one month before and must be paid at reception. The Bentleigh RSL Pension office covers disability pensions, compensation payments, associated allowances, income support payments and treatment available to entitled veterans and former serving members of the Defence Forces and their dependents.

Terry Hogan, Pension Advocate is a qualified Military Compensation Advocate and is up to date on all the Department of Veterans Affairs changes and treat each application with confidentiality and privacy.

Please remember that The Department of Veterans Affairs will not increase your pension without the veteran putting a claim in. Even if you have made a claim and was rejected it is worth trying again as circumstances change.

A reminder that a veteran's GOLD CARD, does not automatically pass onto the widow when they pass away. Please call Sylvia for further information.

Pensions are by appointment only on Tuesday and Thursdays and all appointments are made through Sylvia Lindsay, Welfare Coordinator on 9557 4547 or email sylvia@bentleighrsl.com.au

Welfare Programs – Programs offered at the Bentleigh and Cheltenham campuses but are subject to change with COVID restrictions. Remember these programs are run by volunteers and may not always be available at short notice.

Key Safe Program – The safe is installed and locked at the front of the home with a personalised PIN number and it can only be opened using a PIN number that will only be known by the member, next of kin, Ambulance, Police or Fire Brigade.

In the case of an emergency, the emergency services will obtain the key from the key safe to gain access to the home without them having to break in and cause damage to your property. The Key Safe can also be used if you accidently lock yourself out of the house or a family member needs to access your home in an emergency. All emergency contact details must be updated on the data base every two years via the RSL.

Smoke Detector battery change -

Your smoke detector batteries can be changed annually by our police checked volunteers. Your old smoke detector can also be replaced if required.

Home Maintenance – We offer minor repairs such as replacing light bulbs or fixing leaking taps. We can also recommend genuine trades people if you require larger jobs done at your expense.

Taxi Vouchers – Vouchers are for Veterans and war widows who need to get to medical appointments and are unable to use public transport.

Social Groups – Both campuses offer either a day club or coffee club to socially interact with other people. PACE Health exercises classes are available at Bentleigh.

Friendship Program – If you can no longer get into the RSL and would like to interact with other people, a volunteer can pick you up and bring you in for lunch.

Lawn Mowing and Gardening -

Lawn mowing is only available to veterans who can no longer attend to their own lawns. Please ask family members if they can help you first before contacting the RSL. We do not provide help with weeding.

Medical Aids – We stock a variety of mobility aids available to try or borrow for temporary use only. I recommend consulting your doctor prior to using any mobility aids.

5.A.N.I.T.Y – Seniors and New Information Technology 1:1 private lesson to help you with your laptop, mobile phone, iPad or anything technological you may want to learn. Classes are held on the third Wednesday at Bentleigh. If you would like to take part in the classes, contact **S.A.N.I.T.Y.** on 1300 569 832

Please do not call the RSL to make a booking.

Shopping – We can assist you with grocery and personal shopping if required providing you meet the criteria.

Aged Care and Community Visiting – If you have gone into hospital, have moved into an aged care facility or live alone, we can arrange one of our community visitors or Veteran Support to visit you.

Wayne Holmes has established a men's home visiting program twice a month. He has

established a rapport with the veterans he visits and for many, this is the one thing they look forward to on a regular basis.

We pride ourselves on assisting our members to live at home as independently as possible with all the resources available. Many people are unaware of the services they can access or are entitled to. We can offer a simple home visit or a phone call to start the process of how we can assist you.

We provide information on how to access aged care services, community health respite services and residential care and a broad range of services.





CHELTENHAM CAMPUS MEMORABILIA






