# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As I write this, I feel proud that today the 6<sup>th</sup> of February marks 56 years since the arrival of the Australian Naval Clearance Diving Team Three in South Vietnam.

An elite group who put their lives at risk clearing underwater mines and obstacles during the Vietnam War.

Minister for Veterans' Affairs Matt Keogh said the task that faced the Australian Naval Clearance Divers was complex and dangerous.

"Their work did not have the same profile as that carried out by other elements of the Royal Australian Navy such as the large surface vessels or the Royal Australian Navy Helicopter Flight Vietnam, but it was absolutely vital to the safety of military and civilian shipping during the Vietnam War."

"The country's long coast and many rivers gave the North Vietnamese and the Viet Cong many opportunities to attack and disrupt shipping with mines and underwater obstacles. The primary task of the Australian Naval Clearance Divers was to combat these threats, referred to as 'Stable Door' operations,"

Minister Keogh.

The first of eight clearance diving contingents arrived in Vietnam on 6 February 1967, with each group performing difficult and dangerous tasks throughout the war.

2023 marks the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War. Throughout the year, the Australian Government is recognising the contribution of our Vietnam veterans, at war and in the decades since.

This will culminate in a national commemorative service in Canberra on Vietnam Veterans' Day, 18 August 2023.

Still diving today, my training in the Navy has never left me. I've been a stickler for tidiness and cleanliness and those years left an impression that will never be forgotten. My career after discharge - as a business owner and Captain of numerous Charter Boats - all came from my original seamanship training in the Navy.

# IAN KENNETH BUTCHER VALE

9 March 1941 – 8 December 2022 President from 2008 – 2016

Bentleigh RSL lost one of its finest and esteemed administrators in lan Butcher who left us on December 8 2022.

lan was most admired and honoured for his ongoing devotion to our organisation over many decades and we all have enduring memories of his many achievements. Ian was a leader in so many ways.

He served in the RAAF with distinction and served in Malaya and New Guinea. Born in Ormond he joined the service as a 16yo in Wagga and was discharged from the permanent Air Force in 1986.

But it was the next chapter of his life which altered the direction of the Bentleigh RSL and its members.

In January 1990 Ian joined the Bentleigh RSL as an ordinary member but offered his services as a volunteer and three years later became Assistant Secretary The following year he was elected Secretary and quickly changed Administration involving Licensing and Gaming procedures.

lan was always at the forefront of discussions with Anzac House and took Bentleigh to a new level of expertise.

He was a giant of a man in many ways not only in stature but in work ethic and culture. As long serving member Bernie Borschman, who as a National Serviceman saw action with 1RAR in 1969 - 71, had this to say.

Ian resurrected this Club, giving us stability and a backbone. In 2010, he promoted Glenn Sanders to his present post as Bentleigh Sub-Branch General Manager, and it was no surprise that under their leadership Bentleigh won Branch Of The Year Awards in 2013 and 2017.

Sincere condolences to his family and long-term partner Jenni.

Dear Tammy, Simon and the Bentleigh/Cheltenham RSL Active team, Thank you!

I joined the local RSL as a matter of course when I moved to Cheltenham. I knew few people in the area and while suffering from the effects of PTSD, anxiety and depression my couch was my safe place. I rarely left my unit. I could barely afford to.

The first time I met Tammy and Simon was at Barefoot Bowls. They were welcoming, well organised and effervescent. Since then, I've attended several activities, including Moorabbin Air Museum, rifle shooting, Pinot and Picasso and archery.

This last one, archery, hit the spot. It introduced me to a safe and welcoming place that is nearby. A place where I am re-learning to focus, remain calm and getting on my feet again, literally. Almost every day.

I was there yesterday for a couple of hours. Practicing, chatting with other members, and being completely stunned to see Tammy walking through the entrance. Tammy was there to pay the remainder of my membership (something that had been causing considerable apprehension). Tammy called it a Christmas present.

Knowing that people like Tammy and the RSL Active team are here to help spread support, kindness, and care to many who have rarely received these basic comforts before is truly heartwarming.

I cannot believe that I have been the Welfare Coordinator for 15 years. I feel privileged to be working at Bentleigh RSL and still enjoy coming to work and assisting our veterans, war widows, members and families.

Congratulations to Ray Gordon for receiving his 50-year Membership certificate.

At Bentleigh RSL, we are always looking for white goods, household items, mobility aids and anything else that can be passed on to others who need assistance.

We pride ourselves on assisting our members to live at home as independently as possible with all the resources available. Many people are unaware of the services they can access or are entitled to. We can offer a simple home visit or a phone call to start the process of how we can assist you.

We provide information on how to access aged care services, community health respite services and residential care and a broad range of services. We can also assist you to navigate the myagedcare application process to ensure you are receiving all the care you are entitled to in your own home to maintain independence.

# **WELFARE PROGRAMS**

## **KEY SAFE PROGRAM**

A safe can be installed and locked at the front of the home with a personalised PIN number. It can only be opened using the PIN number, which will only be known by the member, next of kin, Ambulance, Police or the Fire Brigade.

- In the case of an emergency, the emergency services will obtain the key from the key safe to gain access to the home without having to break in and cause damage to your property.
- The key safe can also be used if you accidentally lock yourself out of the house or if a family member needs to access your home. All emergency contact details must be updated on the database every two years via the RSL.

## **SMOKE DETECTOR CHECKS**

Your smoke detector batteries can be changed annually by our police checked volunteers. Your old smoke detector can also be replaced if required.

## TAXI VOUCHERS

Vouchers are for Veterans and war widows who need to get to medical appointments and are unable to use public transport.

## **MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS**

The welfare car is available to transport you to medical appointments.

#### **HOME MAINTENANCE**

We offer minor repairs such as replacing light bulbs or fixing leaking taps. We can also recommend genuine trades people if you require larger jobs done at your expense.

#### LAWN MOWING SERVICES

Lawn mowing is only available to veterans who can no longer attend to their own lawns. Please ask family members if they can help you first before contacting RSL. We do not provide help with weeding.

## S.A.N.I.T.Y

Seniors and New Information Technology provide one-on-one private lessons to help you with your laptop, mobile phone, iPad or anything technological you may want to learn. Classes are held on the third Wednesday at Bentleigh.

#### **SOCIAL GROUPS**

Both campuses offer either a day club or coffee club to socially interact with other people. PACE Health exercise classes are available at Bentleigh.

#### **MEDICAL AIDS**

We stock a variety of mobility aids available to try or borrow for temporary use only. I recommend consulting your doctor prior to using any mobility aids.

## **SHOPPING**

We can assist you with groceries and personal shopping if required providing you meet the criteria.

## FRIENDSHIP PROGRAM

If you can no longer get into the RSL and would like to interact with other people, a volunteer can pick you up and bring you in for lunch.

# AGED CARE AND COMMUNITY VISITING

If you have gone to the hospital, moved into an aged care facility or live alone, we can arrange for one of our community visitors or Veteran Support workers to visit you.

Wayne Holmes has established a men's home visiting program twice a month. He has established a rapport with the veterans he visits and for many, this is the one thing they look forward to on a regular basis. We also offer a female visiting program.

#### **PENSIONS**

The Bentleigh RSL Pension office covers disability pensions, compensation payments, associated allowances, income support payments and treatment available to entitled veterans and former serving members of the Defence Forces and their dependents.

Terry Hogan, Pension Advocate is a qualified Military Compensation Advocate and is up to date on all the Department of Veterans Affairs changes and treats each application with confidentiality and privacy.

Please remember that The Department of Veterans Affairs will not increase your pension without the veteran putting a claim in. Even if you have made a claim and was rejected it is worth trying again as circumstances change.

A reminder that a veteran's GOLD CARD, does not automatically pass onto the widow when they pass away. Please call Sylvia for further information.
