The Cafe area, adjoining the fireplace has proven most popular, as a stop off place for a chat or meeting spot, maybe it's the excellent coffee or the range of cakes that are available, but it can be difficult to get a seat at times. Cheltenham is still going gang busters, with increased patronage in the bar, since the area was made larger. The 50 Acres restaurant continues to be heavily booked, so it's a wise head that ensures they have a seat by booking early. I wish I knew the formula, so I could work out what happened.

The Sports bars are very popular with our footy fans watching their game on the big screen. The recent women's soccer World Cup saw the areas well patronised. Friday Raffles at both campuses continue to attract the big crowds and the introduction of QR codes on the tables for food service is becoming very popular at Bentleigh. Bentleigh RSL is not just a bistro and place to have a drink, perhaps that's how people see us these days but that's far from the truth. Veterans and their family will always get priority after all, that's why the RSL was established, to provide this support. If you think we can help, contact our Veteran and Welfare Officer Sylvia McDonald and she will try assist or refer you to our Pensions Officer or to the department required.

Having created a "monster", that means bus trips, we simply can't keep up with the numbers wanting to get on board. There are budget constraints that require to be observed and we simply can't offer these free excursions to everyone. Buses come at a significant cost and there are other associated costs involved. Please try and understand the situation, after all it was established to get home bound and socially isolated members out of their surroundings so they can associate with others.

Whilst the future looks bright for us, we do face some proposed legislation changes, our management team are ensuring we remain compliant with any new foreseeable changes.

As we move towards the end of the year, I take this opportunity to thank you for your ongoing support.

After 15 years in my role as the Welfare Coordinator, the Welfare team has never been busier providing services, activities and programs to veterans, members, and their families.

Along with welfare advice, financial assistance, food vouchers, transport options, social activities, bus trips and assisting with community resources and our door is always open for a chat.

There has been a major change since the last At Ease, but after 25 years with my partner Rob, we went to Las Vegas and finally got married by Elvis under the Neon sign.

I have officially changed my name to Sylvia McDonald in case anyone is confused.

LAS VEGAD NEVADA The 2023 ANZAC Appeal has seen the tireless work of volunteers who sold badges and many thanks to the community who donated generously to raise a total of \$79,193.50. That is a record amount and the valuable funds raised will go a long way to helping veterans.

The Commemorative ANZAC
Day Services at Bentleigh and
Cheltenham saw record numbers
attend the Dawn service and
the services held during the day,
followed by refreshments. Several
volunteers represented the RSL
at school assembly's, aged care
facilities and sporting groups for
ANZAC Day.

I must thank the 51 volunteers and cadets who gave up their time and contributed over 700 hours to this appeal. The 700 hours are only the recorded times as I know many volunteers do not put in the real time that they contribute. After speaking with other Subbranches, many struggled to get volunteers this year, so we are fortunate to have our great team that support the Welfare department each Appeal.

Several programs held recently have been to the Vietnam Veterans Museum on Phillip Island and 10 pin bowling at Moorabbin. RSL Active provides a way to connect with other veterans and develop social networks, share ideas, tell stories, enhance support circles, and improve physical and mental health.

Vasey RSL Care, Brighton East is now coming to Bentleigh RSL for a monthly lunch and bringing our past veterans and war widows, some who have not been back since covid began. This will be an ongoing event and it's great to see they can still maintain the connection with the RSL after all their years of service.

The computer classes, run by SANITY, are still popular with members attending each month. Everyone who takes part in these classes benefits from learning how to use a mobile phone, using an iPad and keeping up to date with the latest technology. This program has been running for over 10 years, with Richard and Jemma still helping our members on the third Thursday of every month.

WELFARE PROGRAMS

KEY SAFE PROGRAM

The key safe is available to veterans and members feel they need the security of this device.

The safe is installed and locked at the front of the home with a personalised PIN number and it can only be opened using a PIN number that will only be known by the member, next of kin, Ambulance, Police or Fire Brigade.

In the case of an emergency, the emergency services will obtain the key from the key safe to gain access to the home without them having to break in and cause damage to your property. The Key Safe can also be used if you accidentally lock yourself out of the house or a family member needs to access your home in an emergency. All emergency contact details must be updated on the database every 2 years via the RSL.

SMOKE DETECTORS

Your smoke detector batteries can be changed annually by our police checked volunteers. Your old smoke detectors can also be replaced if required.

TAXI VOUCHERS

For Veterans and war widows who need to get to medical appointments and are unable to use public transport.

LAWN MOWING & GARDENING SERVICES

Lawn mowing is only available to veterans who can no longer attend to their own lawns. Please ask family members if they can help you first before contacting the RSL.

HOME MAINTENANCE

We offer minor repairs such as replacing light bulbs or fixing leaking taps. We can also recommend genuine trades people if you require larger jobs done at your expense.

S.A.N.I.T.Y

1:1 private lesson to help you with your laptop, mobile phone, iPad or anything technological you may want to learn. Classes are held on the third Wednesday at Bentleigh. If you would like to take part in the classes, contact S.A.N.I.T.Y. on 1300 569 832. Please do not call the RSL to make a booking.

SOCIAL GROUPS

Both Campuses offer either a day club or coffee club to socially interact with other people.

SHOPPING

We can assist you with groceries and personal shopping if required providing you meet the criteria.

PACE HEALTH MANAGEMENT

Pace Health Management conducts a comprehensive exercise program specifically designed for the senior community. If you have a Gold Card your fee will be covered by the RSL otherwise the cost is \$5.00 per session. All participants must meet with Sylvia or Sophie prior to commencing and have a referral completed by their doctor.

• Beginners: 11.30am - 12.00pm

MEDICAL AIDS

We stock a variety of mobility aids available to try or borrow for temporary use only. I recommend consulting your doctor prior to using any mobility aids.

FRIENDSHIP PROGRAM

If you can no longer get into the RSL and would like to interact with other people, a volunteer can pick you up and bring you in for lunch.

AGED CARE AND COMMUNITY VISITING

If you have gone into hospital, have moved into an aged care facility or live alone, we can arrange for one of our community visitors or Veteran Support to visit you.

We have a men's and women's visiting program in place to maintain the connection between the RSL and home.

PENSIONS

The Bentleigh RSL Pension office covers disability pensions, compensation payments, associated allowances, income support payments and treatment available to entitled veterans and former serving members of the Defence Forces and their dependents.

Terry Hogan, Pension Advocate is a qualified Military Compensation Advocate and is up to date on all the Department of Veterans Affairs changes and treats each application with confidentiality and privacy.

Please remember that The Department of Veterans Affairs will not increase your pension without the veteran putting a claim in. Even if you have made a claim and were rejected it is worth trying again as circumstances change.

A reminder that a veteran's GOLD CARD, does not automatically pass onto the widow when they pass away. Please call Sylvia for further information.


